Kenneth L. Huston is the founder and President of Huston Trust Co LLC., which has several divisions, including commercial cleaning, construction waste removal, workforce development consultation, and entrepreneurial development. He is also the Executive Director of Future Champs, Inc., a workforce development 501 (c)3 for youth and adults. He has co-hosted his own radio show, on B-Pep Community Moments. He was co-chair of the Inter-Agency Council for Pittsburgh Public Schools, sat on the Advisory Board for the Allegheny County Department of Minority, Women, and Disadvantaged Business Enterprise, and served as the first Community Liaison for the Black Political Empowerment Project of the Coalition Against Violence in Pittsburgh. Focusing on violence prevention and intervention in partnership with Carnegie Mellon University and Pittsburgh Public Schools, he served as Interim Director of Employment and Entrepreneurial Development Department for the Urban League of Greater Pittsburgh where he served in that capacity for four years overseeing a 2.7 million-dollar operating budget. He serves as the Pastor of Temple of Faith Ministries of Greensburg established in 1914 and is stated by the saints of old, to be the oldest Church of God in Christ in Pennsylvania. The Ministry was incorporated October of 1967.

Kenneth serves as the President of the NAACP Pennsylvania State Conference as well as the President of the Allegheny East Branch which covers the municipalities of Monroeville, Wilmerding, Pitcairn, Plum, and Murrysville, Wilkins Township, East Pittsburgh, East McKeesport, Turtle Creek, and Churchill.

Kenneth Huston currently serves as a member of the Partnership for Minority on HIV/AIDS Prevention, and the African American Leadership Association. He also serves in Church of God in Christ, Inc., as a National Adjutant in the Church of God in Christ Inc. advisor to Bishop James M. Foster. He is a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Rhema Bible College and Life's Key Bible College, served as a Hospital Corpsman in the U.S. NAVY active duty for six years. He is married to Terri Williams- Huston and the father of six children.

The New Pittsburgh Courier named Kenneth L. Huston one of its “50 Men of Excellence” in 2011. He received the Black Achievement Award of Beaver County in 2015.
