# National Voter Registration Month — Vote.PA.Gov National Voter Registration Day is September 28, 2021

General Election:

Tuesday, November 2, 2021

Voter Registration Deadline: October 18, 2021

You have 4 ways to register to vote.

You can register:

Online

By mail

In person at your county voter registration office At PennDOT and some other government agencies.

# Registration Requirements



- Be a resident of Pennsylvania and the election district in which you want to register and vote for at least 30 days before the next general election.
- Be at least 18 years of age on or before the day of the next general election.

#### College Students

- You can register and vote where you live while attending college in PA or at your prior home address, provided your family or guardian still reside there.
- If you are registering where you live while attending college in PA, you can use either an on campus or off-campus address.
- You can only be registered in one place at a time.


#### Convictions or Prison Detainees Can Register to Vote if you:

- Are a **pretrial detainee**, confined in a penal institution awaiting trial on charges of a felony or a misdemeanor;
- Were ever convicted of a misdemeanor;
- Got released or will get released by the date of the next election from a correctional facility or halfway house. This must be upon completion of the term of incarceration for conviction of a misdemeanor or a felony;
- Are **on probation or released on parole**. This includes parolees who are living in a half way house;
- Are **under house arrest (home confinement).** If this is you, you can vote no matter your conviction status or the status of the conditions of confinement.

The John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act

The John Lewis Voting Rights
Advancement Act passed the House
by a vote of 219-212 on August 24,
2021. A part of H4 is to restore a
provision of the 1965 Voting Rights
Act that was gutted by the Supreme
Court. It would require that
certain jurisdictions with a history
of racial discrimination in voting to
receive approval, known as
preclearance, from the Justice
Department before making changes
to their voting rules.
